Subject: Residential Swimming Pool and Spa Permitting

Authority: Chapter 45, Florida Building Code – Residential (FBC-R), 5th Edition (2014)

Purpose: All pools and spas shall be primary permits. Pool sub-permits may be issued any time after primary permit is issued.

Procedure:

1. Application Process:
All permitted pools and spas will be issued as a “primary” permit with sub-permits for an electric and any other appropriate sub-trade.

2. Drawings and Specifications:
The construction drawings submitted with the application shall indicate the name and address of the pool or spa designer, who shall be a registered engineer with the State of Florida. The engineers’ signature and seal shall be affixed to drawings. Drawings and specifications for pools spas may be set up as “Master” plans. Plans shall include:
 - a) Survey, which will include:
 - Property lines, recorded easements, right of ways and overhead utilities
 - All existing buildings
 - Proposed pool or spa
 - Proposed slopes ,decks, and pool/spa equipment
 - Pool/spa barrier layout and type
 - Minimum setbacks

 - b) Pool and Spa Plan shall include:
 - Conformance standard shall be R401.17, FBC-R 5th Edition (2014)
 - Ladder and step locations
 - Piping layout
 - Anti-entrapment detail
 - Skimmer locations
 - Return inlet locations
 - Electric light locations
 - Diving board location showing required water surfaces
 - Retaining walls, if over two (2) feet high, must be designed by an engineer licensed by the State of Florida and plans must be signed and sealed. The building permit will be issued to a general or building contractor properly registered with or certified by the State of Florida.
 - All electrical work will be to NEC 2011 Code. Electrical work to be by an electrician properly registered or certified by the State of Florida.

3. Inspections shall include:
 - Pool wall
 - Piping Pressure Test
 - Bonding inspection (requires electrical permit)
 - Barrier inspection
 - Final inspection (includes final pool, barrier and electrical)
